Course Outcomes: B.A. in Sociology

B.A. Part I

First Paper : Element of Sociology

Outcomes: This paper will introduce students to new concepts of Sociology discipline. These concepts will enhance the conceptual learning and understanding of the basic concepts used in Sociology. This paper will contribute in enriching the vocabulary and scientific temperament of the students. The course is designed to incorporate all the key concepts of sociology which would enable the learner to develop keen insights to distinguish between the commonsense knowledge and Sociological knowledge.

Second Paper: Indian Social Institution

Outcomes: This paper is designed in this manner, so that students are introduced to the concepts related to Indian Society. They are made familiar with the Indian Society, its linkages and continuity with past and present. It also gives insights to analyze contemporary Indian society. This paper provides comprehensive understanding of Indian society.

B.A. Part II

First Paper: Social control and social change

Outcomes: This paper is designed in a manner, so that students are introduced to the concepts related to Social change and Social Movement. This course will introduce students to the dynamic aspect and dissension tendencies of society. The critical evaluation would enable students to come out with better suggestions, contributing in cohesion of society.

Second Paper: Social disorganization

Outcomes: The syllabus is designed to introduce students to the emerging social problems, the concept and issues of development in Indian Society. The course intends to focus upon the deviant and delinquent behaviour, issue of corruption and other disorganization and structural problems of Indian Society. The endeavour of the course is to make learners aware about the social problems and developmental issues in the Indian Society.

B.A. Part III

First Paper: Perspective in Sociology

Outcomes – The course syllabus is designed to help students to know about the classical contributions of Pioneers of Sociology. The paper will focus upon the history of Sociology and the intellectual traditions originated during the crisis in Europe and the impact it had on the structures of society. The learner will gain theoretical as well as methodological knowledge about the subject.

Second Paper: Social Anthropology

Outcomes -.The paper is designed to enrich the conceptual vocabulary of the students, such that they are equipped with the cultural heritage. This paper is presumably beneficial for the students who are interested in the field work of tribal society, political organization, tribal law and customs.

Third Paper: Techniques of Social Survey and Research

Outcomes - The course of Research Methodology in Social Sciences/Sociology is structured in a way that it makes student to understand and comprehend the research problems, research techniques and nevertheless course intends to develop objective as well as subjective enquiry into the areas of Sociological studies. The main purpose of the course is to develop scientific and humanistic approach towards the research work in the subject.

Course Outcomes: M.A. in Sociology

M.A. Semester I

First Paper : Foundations of Sociological Thought

Outcomes: This paper will introduce students to core concepts of Sociology discipline. The student will learn about the emergence of Sociology as a subject amidst social changes in Europe. The course will further teach about Sociologists like Auguste Comte, Herbert Spencer, Vilfredo Pareto and Durkheim; their individual researches and contributions to the development of Sociology as a subject.

Second Paper: Principles and Methods of Data Collection

Outcomes: The paper aims to help the student to learn about sociological research by enabling him to understand its core concepts. It also elaborates on the various methods of sociological research and the various methods employed in it. It will prepare one to undertake research for analysing sociological studies.

Third Paper: Sociology of Development

Outcomes: The course aims to help students to appreciate the sociological aspects of development in society. The student will be able to understand and connect the various impacts of economic developments and the changes it brings about in society. It will help them to understand the socio-cultural dimensions of economic growth.

Fourth Paper: Society and Culture in contemporary India

Outcomes: The syllabus is designed to introduce students to the social constructs, the concept and issues in contemporary Indian Society. The course intends to focus upon the issues of women, religion, culture, caste and its disorganization and structural problems of Indian Society. The endeavour of the course is to make learners aware about the various facets of Indian society and the social problems and issues in the Indian Society.

M.A. Semester II**First Paper: Modern Sociological Thought**

Outcomes – The course syllabus is designed to help students to know about the classical contributions of Pioneers of Sociology. The paper will focus upon the theories propounded by thinkers such as Marx, Weber, Coolidge, Mannheim and Sorokin. The learner will gain theoretical as well as conceptual knowledge about the subject.

Second Paper: Principles and Methods of Data Analysis

Outcomes - The paper is designed to enrich the students understanding of data analysis. The learner is expected to operate on various datasets, their production and their analysis and representation in lucid format. It enables them to also frame and test hypotheses for research.

Third Paper: Development in India

Outcomes - The student is exposed to development in India since colonial period and beyond. It also helps the student to understand the intersection of culture and development; the impact on the marginalised communities, globalisation and public policy framing.

Fourth Paper: Rural Sociology

Outcomes – The course seeks to help students to understand the various dimensions of rural sociology with special reference to Indian rural society. It imparts them knowledge of traditional Indian village and its institutions. Theories of sankritisation, modernization and urbanization are also dissected. It also discusses the theories of rural development and policy making.

M.A. Semester III**First Paper: Modern Sociological Theory**

Outcomes – The course helps students to understand the finer nuances of various sociological currents such as structural, conflict, phenomenologist and symbolic interactionist. It discusses theories of thinkers such as Parsons, Merton, Dahrendorf, Mead, etc.

Second Paper: Urban Sociology

Outcomes – The course explains the meaning and concept of urbanisation and urban growth and their related concepts of class, family, government etc. The focus is primarily on urban aspects of culture and Indian cities. The emerging problems in cities such as slums and over population are also dissected and solutions to those are also discussed.

Third Paper: Industrial Sociology

Outcomes – It discusses the nature and scope of Industrial Sociology from the industrial revolution to modern industries with special reference to India. It also analyses concept of work, disputes, management and related concepts.

Fourth Paper: Gender and Society

Outcomes – It elucidates on the social construction of gender and deconstructs it from a sociological standpoint. Various issues of feminism and movements in India and the world are also taught. It helps understand social development and its impact on modern gender notions too.

M.A. Semester IV

First Paper: Contemporary Sociology Theory

Outcomes – It sheds light on the neo schools of sociology which developed post WWII. The modern contemporary theorists such as Habermas, Gramsci, Derrida, Foucault etc are taught. It equips student to understand modern contemporary sociological strands.

Second Paper: Sociology of Crime

Outcomes – It helps the learner to understand about Criminology and major theories of crime and criminals. It sheds light on the themes of corruption, victimology, delinquency, etc. It studies correctional measures and prison reforms too.

Third Paper: Political Sociology

Outcomes – It helps students understand the definition and subject matter of political sociology

and the interrelationship between politics and society. It also sheds light on elite theories of sociology and concepts and features of bureaucracy with special reference to India. Political parties and their social functions are also taught.

Fourth Paper: Social Demography

Outcomes – It discusses the scope of social demography and various theories of population and their critique. Features of population and its pyramid and the interface between population and development
